Comment

As part of the planning scheme amendment associated with the PSP, changes to the schedule to Clause 52.17 Native Vegetation need to be made. These changes are required so that a planning permit is not required to clear native vegetation where it is carried out in accordance with the approvals made pursuant to section 146B of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (Cth) and the Native Vegetation Retention and Removal Plan. This exemption is an important mechanism in turning off

Exemption:

All native vegetation removal, destruction or lopping of which is required for any development that is subject to and carried out in accordance with 'Final approval for urban development in three growth corridors under the Melbourne urban growth program strategic assessment, 5 September 2013' made pursuant to section 146B of the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (Cth).

This does not apply to native vegetation or scattered trees identified as to be retained in a precinct structure plan incorporated in this scheme.

Standard note to be included within the UGZ and IPO

DELWP require the following note to be included in the relevant schedules to the Urban Growth Zone (UGZ3) and Incorporated Plan Overlay (IPO4) applying to the Beveridge North West precinct structure plan area.

Note to be included:

Operation of Commonwealth Environmental Laws. On 5 September 2013 an approval under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act) was issued by the Commonwealth Minister for Environment, Heritage and Water. The approval applies to all actions associated with urban development in growth corridors in the expanded Melbourne 2010 Urban Growth Boundary as described in page 4 in the Biodiversity Conservation Strategy for Melbourne's Growth Corridors (Department of Environment and Primary Industries, 2013). The Commonwealth approval has effect until 31 December 2060. The approval is subject to conditions specified at Annexure 1 of the approval. Provided the conditions of the EPBC Act approval are satisfied individual assessment and approval under the EPBC Act is not required.
