Re: Exhibition of Amendment C106mith to the Mitchell Planning Scheme (Beveridge North West Precinct Structure Plan)

I refer to the above matter and offer the following comments.

Three non-government school sites are identified on the Beveridge North West Precinct Structure Plan (PSP), which is consistent with the future demand for Catholic schools in this area identified by Catholic Education Melbourne (CEM). We support the future provision of two Catholic primary schools and one Catholic secondary school.

CEM require a 3 hectare site for a primary school to allow for education facilities that include 2.6 hectares to accommodate the primary school and an additional 0.4 hectares to accommodate our own ancillary education facilities. A 7 hectare site is required for the secondary school.

Three road frontages for a Catholic school site with a site dimension achieving a 60:40 ratio is the optimum preferred outcome.

Suggested changes to the exhibited Beveridge North West Precinct Structure plan to address the principles outlined above include:

Western non-government school location

In relation to the location of the westernmost non-government school we advise that the non-government school is relocated to the north of the local town centre adjacent to the linear park along the creek. This removes the site from being directly opposite the proposed government school site and the local community facility. It is also necessary to ensure that:

 A safe pedestrian/bicycle link is provided to connect to the broader road network and community facilities.

Central non-government school location

CEM has no objection to the proposed location for a Catholic secondary school but requires that:

- The site has an area of at least 7 hectares with the site dimension providing a 60:40 ratio
- A safe pedestrian link is provided to the open space are to the south over the collector road
- A safe pedestrian/bicycle link is provided to connect to the broader road network and community facilities.

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Eastern non-government school location

CEM has no objection to the proposed location for a Catholic primary school but requires that:

- The site has an area of at least 3 hectares with the site dimension providing a 60:40 ratio.
- A safe pedestrian/bicycle link is provided to connect to the broader road network and community facilities.

Designation of Catholic school sites

The Precinct Infrastructure Plan at page 52 in Appendix 4 identifies the schools intended for non-government (Catholic) schools as 'Private Education'.

It is considered that the more appropriate designation would be "Non-government Education Provider" as this is the terminology typically used for Future Urban Structure Plan.

PSP Background report

There is no background report exhibited in association with the Beveridge North West PSP.

A recent change in policy at the VPA is to no longer designate Catholic education as the lead agency identified to deliver non-government education in the Precinct Infrastructure Plan (PIP) table of the Precinct Structure Plan.

The policy change noted that Catholic education would remain as the lead agency in the background report. The significance of the background report is that it directs landowners to contact CEM to acquire non-government school sites. There is no background report in association with the Beveridge North West PSP and landowners are likely to seek offers for non-government school sites from the market.

The lack of a background report is significant. It forms part of the VPA Standard Approach for Non Government School Sites in Precinct Structure Plans document, as agreed between CEM and the VPA; and it is the key outcome for CEM as part of the process of working with the VPA to strategically justify the sites identified as non-government schools, and therefore Catholic schools, on the PSP.

A copy of the most recent draft of the VPA pamphlet, **VPA Standard Approach for Non-Government School Sites in Precinct Structure Plans**, is attached.

The background report is the only means available in the PSP process to provide a degree of certainty of provision and delivery of future Catholic schools in growth areas.

CEM requests that the VPA honour the process outlined in the *Standard Approach for Non Government School Sites in Precinct Structure Plans*. In lieu of a background report, the VPA is obliged to provide a mechanism to ensure greater certainty in the delivery of Catholic schools in the Beveridge North West PSP in return for our commitment to engage in the process and ensure the optimal delivery of education infrastructure to this future community.

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VPA STANDARD APPROACH FOR NON GOVERNMENT SCHOOL SITES IN PRECINCT STRUCTURE PLANS

The following table outlines the standard approach currently taken by the Victorian Planning Authority (VPA) when Precinct Structure Plans (PSPs) show strategically justified non-government school sites.

Note: This approach may vary over time and/or to reflect the individual characteristics of a Precinct Structure Plan.
