



## Frequently Asked Questions

### **What is the minimum and maximum funding grant available?**

There is no specified minimum or maximum grant. In the past Streamlining for Growth has provided grants to Councils ranging from around \$10,000 to \$240,000.

As outlined in the website program summary, this year we are strongly favouring grants for projects that are of an appropriate scale to deliver significant outcomes and / or will deliver substantial process and / or capacity improvement across several councils. While there is a preference for larger grants, projects of a more modest scale will be considered if it can be demonstrated they can deliver very effective outcomes or if it is, for example, contributing to a larger project with other funds or in-kind support provided by Council or other project partners.

### **Can my Council apply for multiple projects?**

Yes. However, one or two well developed and scoped project proposals would likely have a greater chance of success than a larger number of less developed ideas.

### **Can my Council partner with other Councils to for a grant application?**

Yes – this is encouraged. This could be in the form of a single Council leading / co-ordinating a project on behalf of a group of Councils.

### **Can my Council partner with other state agencies or industry stakeholders?**

Yes. While it may not be possible to provide a grant to a private entity, they could still be a project partner in terms of in-kind support or a cash co-contribution.

### **Can I commence an application and then save it as partly complete so that it can be finished at a later date?**

Yes. If you scroll down to the bottom of the application form you will see a 'save draft' button. You will then be able to access your draft at a later point through the 'My Submissions' tab in your Submittable account.

### **When will I hear if my application has been successful or not?**

Once the application round closes, we will commence internal reviews of all applications. Our aim is to notify Councils of outcomes between December 2020 – February 2021.
