I was set up to do the zoom consultation tomorrow night but something has come up and it will be difficult for me to attend.

My main interest with the East Aberline Precinct planning is in flood management.

I took part in

submissions to the Warrnambool city Council Flood overlay studies.

I have spoken with the Glenelg catchment authority about the planning for the East Aberline area, and they have assured me that no more water is allowed into the catchment than would have previously fallen naturally with landfall. My main question is has the Flood management plan had allowance taken into account for future climate change, for example the 40% increase in rainfall predicted and sea level rises. I see the plan has quite a lot of catchment area for Russell Creek but I was wondering about whether it has taken into account future impact of climate change. I know the Warrnambool city Council decided not to adopt the latest Glenelg catchment authority figures which I believe came into place for a South Warrnambool flood study and was increased because of a 40% increase imposed by a new state government rule? I haven't had that policy completely explained to me and I would appreciate some explanation if you are able to give it?
